The green color, which is also the color of the African Union (AU), indicates KAF's vision towards a prosperous future of both Korea and Africa, as well as symbolizes the younger generation who will play a pivotal role in the Korea-Africa relations.

- Korea obtained an observer status at the African Union (AU) in April 2005. As a follow-up to the "Korea's Initiative for Africa's Development" of March 2006, the Korea-Africa Forum (KOAF) started to convene regularly with the aim of seeking practical and future-oriented cooperation schemes between Korea and Africa.
